Dr. Steven Bedrick is an Associate Professor in OHSU's Department of Medical Informatics and Clinical Epidemiology. His research focuses on biomedical applications for natural language processing technologies, with particular emphases on speech and language disorders and secondary use of electronic medical record data.

Dr. Bedrick's computational areas of interest include: language model development and evaluation, information retrieval, human-computer interaction, and ethical, legal, and social implications (ELSI) of the use and deployment of automated systems in biomedical contexts.
