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






- Working with School Based Health Center

- Ready to quit students offered Not On Tobacco program (NOT)
- Incentives for attending and completing the 10 sessions

- Prior to September 2022, staff trained, protocols developed
- Student artists created informational posters
- School starts Trained BHC resigns position
- SBHC staff announce inability to carry through due to staff shortage
- Students vaping on campus is a concern

THE PLAN DESIGN

Curriculum Adjusted

- Original sessions increased by one
- Weekly lunch session
- On-going enrollment
- Continuous sessions through May 2022

Challenges

- Fidelity compromised
- Hard to track students
- Lack of group cohesiveness
- Mixed outcomes

RESULTS

- Students Enrolled 18
- Ready to Quit 61% were a 10 (0-10 scale)
- 66% completed all sessions
- One student completed NOT over the summer
- HRVHS Administration excited to continue the program in 2023-24 school year
