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# KUDOS

Congratulations to Dr. Michael Mooney whose recent study was published this past week in the <u>Journal of Neuroscience</u>. The study further unravels the complex relationship between brain connectivity and behavioral disorders. "Our group at OHSU is very interested in identifying risk factors for ADHD so that we can improve assessment for kids who may be living with this disorder," said Mooney, Ph.D., assistant professor of medical informatics and clinical epidemiology in the OHSU School of Medicine, faculty in

OHSU's Center for Mental Health Innovation and the study's corresponding author. "By evaluating the cumulative effects of regions across the entire brain, we are now looking at ADHD as a whole-brain issue, which could make it easier to predict which kids have ADHD and how severe it may be," Mooney continued. "Down the road, we hope this will help with early identification of kids at most risk, so they can get the help they need as soon as possible."



Dr. David Dorr has received a task order contract from AHRQ for an ACTION-IV project, along with MPIs Dr. Debbie Cohen and Dr. Ana Quinones in Family Medicine. The project, entitled Person-Centered Care Planning for Persons with Multiple Chronic Conditions, will look at PCCP and how it is implemented for people with multiple chronic conditions by conducting searches of the literature and key informant interviews; convening successive roundtable discussions with policymakers and health care leaders and a learning collaborative with experts and front-line providers to better understand both the promise of PCCP and the issues curtailing this promise. Dr. Annette Totten is a co-investigator and in addition to Dr. Dorr's research team, the project also involves staff of the Evidence-based Practice Center, along with faculty and staff in ORPRN, General Internal Medicine and Geriatrics, and the School of Nursing. Dr. Annette Totten, EPC Co-Director, and Dr. Diane Stadler, School of Medicine and Director of Human Nutrition programs at OHSU and Associate Director of Nutrition at the Moore Institute, have been awarded a contract from the Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality (AHRQ) to co-lead a systematic review entitled Digestible Carbohydrate Intake and Maternal-Infant Outcomes. The findings from this review will guide the US and Canadian federal Dietary Reference Intake (DRI) committees and the National Academies of Sciences, Engineering, and Medicine (NASEM) in their reviews of digestible carbohydrate intake during pregnancy and in children under two years.
