# 2. POSITION SUMMARY:

# Background information about the program/department

Cystic Fibrosis (CF) is an inherited disorder that causes repeated lung infections, digestive problems, and other complications. It is progressive, meaning it worsens over time. OHSU is one of two cystic fibrosis care centers in Oregon and our center provides care for patients from all over the state of Oregon and parts of Southwest Washington. People with CF usually hospitalized for up to 14 days when they are experiencing an exacerbation.

# Summary of qualifications (includes minimum age requirement)

Volunteers must be 18 years or older and should have knowledge of Cystic Fibrosis. Volunteers must be able to communicate effectively, listen empathetically, maintain appropriate boundaries, respect privacy and keep information about patients, families, and staff, strictly confidential. Volunteers must be able to recognize and respect the multi-cultural needs of our patients and families with a non-judgmental and accepting attitude.

#### Summary of duties

- Under the direction of the OHSU Cystic Fibrosis Medical Team, volunteer will visit with hospitalized CF patients at bedside or by phone to provide non-therapeutic and non-clinical emotional support.
- Working in collaboration with the Adult CF team, participate in meetings as needed in support of QI efforts.
