2. POSITION SUMMARY:			

Background information about the program/department

Candlelighters provides support for families every step of the way, from diagnosis through treatment and beyond, providing programs such as emergency financial assistance, support groups for parents/caregivers, a youth program (ages 13-21), an annual family camp, family activities, bereavement support, and a weekly snack cart.

Once a week (currently Fridays), the *snack cart* rolls through the halls of Doernbecher 10 South offering snacks to patients and their family members to help make days a bit brighter.

Summary of qualifications

This position requires a minimum age of 18 years old and must pass Doernbecher's volunteer training requirements. Due to limited spots available, volunteers need to be referred by a Child Life Specialist from Doernbecher Children's Hospital. Those who are interested in applying to be a volunteer may also contact Candlelighters of Oregon.

Summary of duties

Help provide food and treats to children and their families in the oncology unit. Duties include rolling the cart in the hallway, stopping at appropriate rooms to offer snacks, assisting families with choosing, and handing items to them once they've chosen.

Summary of interactions

Volunteers will interact with children who are in the pediatric oncology inpatient unit and their families.

 Go to the lockbox on the 11th floor to access the key for the food service closet. The code is 02468. Key into the food service closet to get the snack cart. Return the key until you need to put the cart back at the end of the visit. Put on hand sanitizer. Wipe down cart with cleaning wipes. Arrange snacks on the cart and double-check the ex piration dates on the snacks. Once the cart is ready, take the elevator back to the 10th floor. Go to 10s (the inpatient unit). Be sure to put approved mask on before entering. Go through the door, wash your hands, and check in at the nurses' station. Go to each patient room door, unless otherwise noted, and gently knock. Constantly use hand sanitizer throughout the visit. To minimize the risk of spreading germs or viruses, please pick out a snack for each person. Do not allow anyone to touch/go through the snacks. After completing 10s, go to 10C and start visit in waiting room. Then, follow the route through the infusion center and the ex am rooms, and ex it through the waiting area. After completing 10C, head back to the elevator. Take the cart back to the 11th floor and store in the food service closet. Put all snacks in the cart and lock the cart. Place the key back into the lockbox before leaving. 	100%	Yes
