Brief Overview – Israel/ Palestine/ Hamas

- October 2023 Hamas attacked Israeli civilians; took hostages
- Israel responded by closing off the borders and systematically attacking areas in Gaza, moving the citizens from the north to the south, bombing all infrastructure and buildings in the major cities
- ▶ 1.4 million civilian refugees forced to move to Rafah; 1.7 million refugees displaced
- Israeli blocking of aid/ lockdown of borders



Israel Blocking Humanitarian Aid

- Sanitary pads due to nail clippers in hygiene kits
- Sleeping bags due to having zippers
- Tents due to having poles
- ▶ Food
- Volunteers (limiting to only 25 total allowed every week)
- Water purification tablets/ filters
- Medications

Cadus – German Humanitarian Organization

Non-profit, independent, international emergency response organization from Berlin.

Currently active in Ukraine and Gaza, but have operated in Northeast Syria, Iraq, Greece, and Bosnia.

Gaza – Trauma Stabilization Points (TSPs), Medevac, Local Hospital Support

Trauma Stabilization Point

Two main functions:

- 1. Triage, treatment and discharge of minor patients
- Triage, stabilization and referral of critical patients with lifethreatening or limb-threatening injuries

Both of these functions can substantially decrease the burden on referral hospitals.



Palestinian Red Crescent (PRCS)



Trauma Stabilization Point – 2 patient care tents Cadus Tent – mostly trauma patients PRCS Tent – mostly medical complaints/ wound care

Palestinian Red Crescent Society (PRCS) – Red Cross Chapter in Gaza

- Most of the doctors and nurses were volunteers who were displaced refugees
- Many were students or newly graduated from medical school or nursing school with limited prior experience.

- Various Medical Supplies



Traumatic Injuries (676)& General Medical Problems (465)

	Type of Injury	Injury Count *	Injury Percentage
1.	Medical problem(s)	465	46%
2.	Penetrating (e.g. gunshot or shrapnel injuries)	204	20%
3.	Blunt trauma (e.g. blast trauma)	146	14%
4.	Laceration(s)	135	13%
5.	Other	89	9%
6.	Fracture(s)	69	7%
7.	Burn(s)	29	3%
8.	Amputation(s)	4	0%






















