Program Overview


HERO Kids is a voluntary, no-cost registry that allows families to record critical health details that inform emergency medical services and hospital emergency departments. For providers faced with split-second decisions, the HERO Kids Registry fills the information gap. Families across Oregon have easy access to this reliable system for health emergency preparedness. HERO Kids is not just for kids; it is open to **any** Oregon child or young adult through age 26.

New Emergency Preparedness Materials

HERO Kids has new educational materials focused on emergency preparedness. These materials are available on the website, and include a flyer for EMS/EDs, family-facing rack cards, and an interactive poster for presentations. 

- For large agencies and hospitals, a mass user registration option is now available.






