

What does a community health worker do?

- Serve as an intermediary between health, social services and community
- Facilitate improved access to services
- Improve quality and cultural competency of service delivery
- Build relationships with community members to assess health needs and goals
- Provide social support, interventional counseling, and teach basic health education

Training & Supervision Requirements

Training:

- OHA approval training
- 3,000 hours lived experience











Supervision:

- Clinical supervision
- Continuing education

- Ohio: Kinder Readiness Coordinators




The Parent Coach

The addition of the Parent Coach, a central element of the PARENT model of care, adds a much-needed member to the WCC team in the delivery of preventive care services.

Parent Coaches...

- Are trusted community members who are familiar with the community and local resources.
- Receive extensive training in the provision of WCC services.
- Address concerns related to anticipatory guidance topics, family social and psychosocial needs, and development and behavior, and connect families to community resources.






Community Health Worker:

- 1. Introduces skills needed for Kinder
- 2.Evaluates child's skills using Brigance assessment
- Sets home practice goals with parent
- 4. Models an activity
- Connects family to preschool & community resources
- 6. Gives learning tools for home practice

Early Childhood Development Program

Our certified Early Childhood Development program coordinators can support your family by assessing your child's developmental needs, playing with your child and helping your child learn. Our goal is to serve all children who have developmental delays or who are at risk for delays. We try to help each child meet developmental milestones as they are able.

What is Developmental Play?

Developmental play is positive interaction with your child which promotes learning. It includes playing peeka-boo, reading a book, or singing to your child. Play is an important part of providing comfort and security for your child.



CHWs for Adults CHWs for Pediatrics



Challenges

Finding the right person with pediatric <u>and</u> community experience

Training and state registration processes

Ongoing support, continuing education, and supervision

Reimbursement challenges and creativity



Key Considerations for Implementing CHWs in Pediatrics

- Incorporate reimbursement for CHW services in Medicaid programs.
- Offer additional education to CHWs working with pediatric populations.
- Engage cross-sector partners to align CHW programs.
