
Oregon AHEC Program Guide

















Our Mission

Oregon Area Health Education Center (AHEC) is part of a nationwide system created by Congress in 1971 to improve the distribution, diversity, quality and supply of health care workers in rural and under-resourced areas.

We have education programs across five regional centers and a program office at Oregon Health & Science University. Programs are designed to engage aspiring health care professionals at each step of their journey, which starts with career exploration in their youth, follows them through their education and continues after they obtain their credentials.

Health Occupations



Location: St. Charles Health System **Description:** Cascades East AHEC hosts clinical shadowing experiences for high school students at St. Charles Health System in coordination with participating school districts.

American Heart Association Basic



Life Support and CPR **Duration:** One day

Description: Provides the opportunity for high school students and pre-med students to become certified in Basic Life Support (BLS) and CPR.

Diagnosis Day



Location: St. Charles Bend Campus **Description:** Diagnosis Day is a oneday experience for rural high school students in the Cascades East region, held on the St. Charles Bend campus. This is collaboration between Cascades East AHEC and participating school districts.

MQ Day Camp



Location: Varies

Description: High schools and other community organizations that serve high school students are welcome to request a camp be held for their students, and then Northeast Oregon AHEC will work to make it happen. All eligible participants affiliated with the local program will be accepted.

Ambassador Program

Description: A paid summer experience for 1-2 selected students from Jefferson and Crook County. Experience consists of 160 hours of clinical shadowing with hands-on tasks that help the hospital operate.

Duration: Varies

Description: This program helps bridge the gap between high school and professional-level education for college students interested in health care careers.



Duration: Gap year

Description: Offers college graduates mentorship and temporary employment as medical assistants and phlebotomists during a gap year while students apply to advanced health professions programs.



Duration: Two years concurrent with your health professions program **Description:** AHEC Scholars is a two-year national program designed to better prepare health profession students for future practice in underserved communities. Scholars gain hands-on experience and skills that prepare them to serve in high-need communities across Oregon. We partner with public and private colleges and universities across the state to support student participation and broaden our impact.

Independent Job Shadowing



Location: St. Charles Health System

Description: Cascades East AHEC coordinates clinical job shadowing requests for St. Charles Health System. Participants must be a high school graduate and at least 18 years old to request shadowing.
