With social, economic, and political stressors, as well as extreme weather disasters accelerating worldwide, the urgency of organizing community-led resilience networks (TRCNs) everywhere has never been greater.

To prevent and heal social, psychological, emotional, and many physical health impacts resulting from rising stressors, emergencies, and disasters a primary focus of local resilience networks must be to form robust social support networks and engage residents in providing mutual aid to each other.

The ITRC is holding a Community of Practice (CoP) on Thursday March 12 that will teach participants how to address these needs.
