



Alaska Native Medical Center: High-quality, culturally sensitive health care

The Alaska Native Medical Center (ANMC) provides acute, specialty, primary and behavioral health care to Alaska Native and American Indian people living in the state. The 182-bed hospital provides comprehensive medical services and works in close partnership with Alaska’s rural health facilities to support a broad range of health care and related services.

As the statewide referral center, ANTHC operates both the Qujana House and ANMC Patient Housing facility, which provide a combined 257 rooms for out-of-town patients and their escorts. The ANTHC-owned SpringHill Suites University Lake offers an additional 159 rooms and is solely utilized for patients and escorts. These facilities are supported by our Patient Logistics team, who assist with housing, travel services and Medicaid authorizations.

Mission: The Alaska Native Medical Center fulfills the mission and vision of the Alaska Native Tribal Health Consortium (ANTHC) and Southcentral Foundation (SCF) by working together with the Native community to achieve wellness by providing the highest quality health services for all Alaska Native people.

History: In the 1950s, the Bureau of Indian Affairs (later transferred to the Indian Health Service) began providing health care for Alaska Native people. By 1999, ANTHC and SCF assumed operation of programs at ANMC under the terms of Public Law 105-83. Today, ANMC has become a world leader in health care where advanced technology meets culturally sensitive patient-and-family-centered care. ANMC is also a gathering place where longtime friends celebrate life events, learn ways to maintain wellness and simply visit one another.

- 1955** The Indian Health Service was established as a bureau of the U.S. Public Health Service, and assumed management of ANS
- 1953** Under Bureau of Indian Affairs management, Anchorage Medical Center of the Alaska Native Service (known as ANS) opens on Third Avenue in Anchorage
