

Pre-Entrance Immunization Requirements and Instructions

Student Health and Wellness Center



Fees & Holds

- ▶ If you are unable to complete the requirements prior to matriculation, **you will have 14 days after matriculation to complete, or a \$95 fee will be charged.**
- ▶ If you are not compliant with all requirements **within 30 days after matriculation**, a hold will be placed on your student account that will suspend your student status and prevent you from registering and attending classes.
- ▶ If you are in the process of obtaining a series vaccination, that is considered compliant **as long as you are completing each step in a timely manner and forwarding us the documentation.** This will not affect your ability to get your ID badge at orientation.
- ▶ Timely manner means you are not missing due dates provided by SHW compliance and you are following the CDC vaccine schedule

For example: Most students that are working on a hep b vaccine booster series, in order to obtain a positive titer, will not finish the booster series before starting school. As long as you are following the CDC recommended guidelines for obtaining the vaccines, and meeting any due dates given by the compliance team, you will remain in compliance.

- ▶ Denote that **documentation** is attached

- ▶ **Attach** all applicable proof and completed form as a Word Document, PDF, or JPEG. Do NOT paste photos of documents into the body of the email. Documentation **MUST** have your name and date of birth included.

- ▶ For security reasons we cannot access embedded files/links or HEIC document types

- ▶ **You will be asked to resubmit if documentation guidelines are not followed.**

Tetanus-Diphtheria-Pertussis (TDP)

- For this section, you need **two** items:
- 1) Date of completion of your Tdap received after your 11th birthday. If more than **10 years ago**, you need a booster
 - 2) Td Booster that is less than 10 years old
- OR**
- 2) Tdap Booster that is less than 10 years old

1) Positive measles, mumps, and rubella titer

► Varicella

1) Two doses of the Varicella vaccine

OR

1) Positive varicella titer

Hepatitis B (HepB)

► For this section, **all** students must include **one** of the following:

1) Three dose HepB series (*Engerix-B, Recombivax, Twinrix*)

OR

1) Two dose HepB Series (*Heplisav-B*)

► If you are student who will have direct patient contact or sharps/instruments contaminated with human/primate **blood or body fluids**:

2) Positive HepB **Surface Antibody** Titer

Negative HepB Titer?

- ▶ There are **two** options for completing the HepB booster vaccination series:
 - 1) **Heplisav (2)**: the second dose can be received four weeks after the first dose
 - 1) **Engerix (3)**: the second dose can be received four weeks after the first dose. The third dose will be six months after the first dose
- ▶ After completing a series, wait **four weeks** before trying another titer
 - ▶ You may also attempt a titer after one booster vaccine, but if it comes back negative you must complete the whole series and try again for a positive titer
- ▶ Keep us updated on your booster progress!!

Tuberculosis (TB) Screening

- ▶ Please include **one** of the following:
 - 1) Two negative two-step TB skin tests 12 months prior to enrollment. Two individual placements and two subsequent reads

OR

 - 1) One negative TB blood test 12 months prior to enrollment (*QuantiFERON TB Gold or T-Spot*)

- ▶ If you have a **positive** TB screening, please reach out to SHWCompliance@ohsu.edu for guidance!

Commonly Asked Questions

What is my due date?

- ▶ The due date given by your program for turning in the Immune Status Form is **not the due date that all the requirements** need to be completed
- ▶ You can be **in process** with requirements when turning in your form and when you start school
- ▶ To obtain your OHSU ID badge, submission of your Immune Status Form to the Student Health & Wellness Compliance team is **required** before your first day of class
- ▶ If you have not submitted your Immune Status Form, OHSU Parking and Transportation will be unable to issue your ID badge

Commonly Asked Questions

Do I need to have a Hepatitis B antibody titer drawn?

- ▶ Not all students need a Hepatitis B surface antibody titer. However, All OHSU students are required to have completed the **Hepatitis B vaccination series**
- ▶ Only students who will have patient contact, primate contact, or exposure to human blood, tissue or cell lines are required to have a positive titer in addition to completing the Hepatitis B vaccination series
- ▶ **Students enrolled in the following OHSU programs do NOT need a titer:** Biomedical Informatics, Biostatistics, Computer Science and Engineering, Electrical Engineering, Environmental Science and Engineering, Health Science Technology and Entrepreneurship, and Masters in Public Health.
- ▶ **If your program was not listed above, you need a hep b surface antibody titer**

Commonly Asked Questions

Where can I get vaccinations, titers, and tuberculosis screening done?

- ▶ These services are available from a variety of community resources including your primary care provider, OHSU primary care providers, clinical pharmacists at your local pharmacy, potentially at Walgreens, Safeway or Costco, and Multnomah County Immunization Clinics
- ▶ For lab services, such as titers and Tuberculosis testing, online/mobile lab clinics like Quest Diagnostics and Labcorp are an option

Commonly Asked Questions

What if I cannot find any of my records?

- ▶ Try contacting your undergraduate school, the county where you received childhood vaccines, a pediatrician, or parent/guardian to see if there are any records available
- ▶ If you cannot obtain documentation, titers can be obtained to check for immunity for most of the required vaccinations, or you can revaccinate
- ▶ If you are a student that needs a positive surface antibody titer for your program, you will **ALSO** need to have record of a completed hepatitis b vaccine series in addition to the titer
- ▶ As a Healthcare worker, you will need this information for the rest of your career.

Commonly Asked Questions

Is history of disease for chicken pox acceptable documentation proof?

- ▶ **No**, a history of disease **will not** make you compliant with the Varicella requirement. We need to see proven immunity to the disease
- ▶ Students need either a positive Varicella titer, or documentation of a completed vaccine series
- ▶ If you had chicken pox before receiving any vaccines, or you only have one vaccine, you need to complete a titer. Your titer will prove immunity
- ▶ Students should only get a titer done if they had chicken pox, or had two vaccines, but do not have documentation proof.
