


## Glenn Rodriguez, MD Featured

The mother was quite emotional and teary when two staff members showed up with a car full of gifts to be opened on Christmas Day! She was beyond thankful and gave out hugs while wishing much love and blessings for everyone in the clinic.

It meant a great deal to the South Waterfront team to be a part of this amazing opportunity. Their hopes are that each clinic at OHSU will continue to help make a difference in the lives of our community members in the future.

### Residency Interview Season – By Roger Garvin, MD

The Family Medicine Residency in Portland has had a great interview season. We had continued increase in applications from across the country and around the globe. There were applications from students attending over 80 schools in the United States. We had a total of almost 900 applications this year. We have interviewed 116 applicants.

Each applicant had an opportunity to interview with two faculty members and one resident. The applicants were able to visit the OHSU hospitals and clinics during their interview day as well. Residents hosted a dinner twice a week for the applicant groups.

Applicants have been very impressed with the great work that is occurring in our department in the areas of education, patient care and research. They were struck by the passionate people who work here.

I want to personally thank all of the residents and faculty who put time into interviews, lunches, dinners and putting applicants up at night. The process of choosing our next resident class is one of the most important that we do. I want to thank everyone else for helping with schedule coordination and for being part of clinics that I am so proud of showing to our visitors.

We will be crafting our rank list in February with further input from faculty and residents. We will announce our new resident class on the 18th of March.






