### A. Personal Statement

My background in policy, sociology/demography and patient centered outcomes research will enable me to contribute significantly to this study. I recently completed an Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality (AHRQ) funded career development award (K12) in comparative effectiveness and patient-centered outcomes research at Oregon Health & Science University (OHSU). During my tenure as a K12 scholar, I gained valuable hands-on training in clinical and patient-centered outcomes research and conducted mixed-methods research to explore the factors that shape variation in hospital policy and provider and patient decision-making on mode of delivery after cesarean. I also worked on three AHRQ-commissioned studies to develop methods for engaging stakeholders (including policymakers, clinicians, and patients) in the research enterprise. At the conclusion of my K12 training, I embarked on a joint appointment as a Research Assistant Professor at OHSU and an Investigator at OCHIN. I am currently co-investigator on three projects: 1) a RWJ-funded project to explore clinic level practice change in response to Oregon's Alternative Payment Methodology demonstration project, 2) a PCORI funded project that aims to develop innovative information technology tools to improve continuity of insurance coverage for kids, and 3) a VA-funded project to establish the feasibility of creating a library of patient-narratives to inform patient-centered outcomes research for Veterans with diabetes and traumatic brain injury. Early in my career, I made a deliberate decision to gain training and experience in both health policy and research with the ultimate goal of bridging the gap between these two worlds and conducting research with a measurable impact on population health. I am eager to use my skills and training to evaluate tools to increase insurance coverage among poor and underserved populations, and specifically to understand the impact of these tools on improving cancer screening rates and overall health outcomes.
