Focus on Research: NIH Task Force on Research Standards for Chronic Low Back Pain

For 2 years, **Rick Deyo, MD, MPH**, has co-chaired an NIH Task Force on Research Standards for Chronic Low Back Pain. The goal was to recommend more consistent ways of classifying patients and reporting research results. The NIH will require use of the standards in all grant applications dealing with chronic low back pain. The Task Force just published its report in the *Journal of Pain* (2014; 15: 569-85) with simultaneous publication in *Spine*, *The Spine Journal*, *Clinical Journal of Pain*, and the *European Spine Journal*.
