The Child Development & Rehabilitation Center (CDRC) Congenital Brain Anomalies Program evaluates children with specific and complex congenital brain malformations. A Pediatric Neurologist or Developmental Pediatrician evaluates all children referred to the clinic and in some cases a Speech-Language Pathologist also completes language and developmental evaluations.

Conditions Seen in Our Clinic

The structural brain malformation diagnoses of children seen in this program include:

- Microcephaly
- Macrocephaly
- Schizencephaly
- Lissencephaly/Pachygyria
- Agenesis of Corpus Callosum
- Holoprosencephaly
- Septo-optic dysplasia
- Porencephaly
- Hydranencephaly
- Cerebellar hypoplasia
- Joubert syndrome

Services We Provide

The Congenital Brain Anomalies Program works with OHSU Radiology to offer a full spectrum of neuroimaging diagnostic services including the most advanced MRI scan sequences available to support the detection of even subtle brain abnormalities. We also work closely with other groups at CDRC and OHSU including:

Evaluation and Management

Patients seen in the Congenital Brain Anomalies Program are evaluated by a Pediatric Neurologist or Developmental Pediatrician as well as, in many cases, a Speech-Language Pathologist the same day.

Our staff is committed to evaluating children with developmental and medical issues, and to helping families obtain the appropriate therapy and medical resources they need.

Our program team stays in touch with the children we see and follows their progress. We will work with families to ensure that the appropriate services, support, and resources are available to them and their children.
