Inpatient locations	Who needs a mask	Why
Adult and pediatric emergency rooms and emergency waiting areas	All patients, visitors and staff	<p>Patients/visitors may not have been screened for COVID-19</p> <p>Patients may be immunocompromised or at high risk</p> <p>Open environment</p>
Adult and pediatric cancer units (14K, 13K, 10S)	All patients, visitors and staff	Patients are immunocompromised or at high risk
Adult and pediatric intensive care units	All patients, visitors and staff	Patients are immunocompromised or at high risk
Adult dialysis unit	All patients, visitors and staff	<p>Patients are at high risk</p> <p>Open environment</p>
Units and care areas, when entering a patient room or in direct patient care	All staff	Less risk to patients
Outpatient locations	Who needs a mask	Why
Certain adult and pediatric cancer and infusion areas, as set by OHSU leaders	All patients, visitors and staff	<p>Patients are immunocompromised or at high risk</p> <p>Open environment</p>
Other locations	Who needs a mask	Why
All settings, upon patient request	All staff	Respect for patients, family members and caregivers
All settings	Anyone with symptoms of COVID-19 or another respiratory infection (runny nose, cough, sneeze, etc.)	<p>CDC recommendations</p> <p>Required per COVID Illness Exclusion and Return to Work guidelines</p>
Any unit or area experiencing an outbreak (3 or more people from one department, or 6% or more of the department, per OHSU Occupational Health)	All patients, visitors and staff	CDC recommendations
All settings	Anyone who has had close contact or a high-risk exposure to someone with COVID-19 in the prior 10 days	CDC recommendations

Other locations	Who needs a mask	Why
All settings on OHSU-owned or controlled property	Any staff working on campus with approved medical or religious exceptions to vaccination and who are not fully vaccinated	COVID-19 Immunizations and Education policy
